Routine:		
Breakfast	between 6.30am and 7am

Vaccinations: Gumtree will provide you with his vaccination certificate		
Worming	Sentinel Spectrum given on the 1st of each month. He has had his October one already. He did not like to eat the chew on it's own so I had to cut it up into small bits and hide it in his food!	
Tick prevention:	He has a new Preventix tick collar on which lasts 2 months, put on on 13th October and has also been sprayed with Frontline Tick spray which lasts up to 3 weeks. Date of spray was 11th October.	



## Training:

Verbal cues he knows:

- On your bed
- Drop
- Spin
- Twirl
- Heel used when out walking to get his attention back and for him to focus on me
- Look used sometimes when out walking and wanting to bring his attention back to me
- Easy if he's walking too far ahead or starting to fixate on another dog. This with a little tug on the lead helps him reduce his speed
- Wait at doors if he's too eager to get out or if we stop on our walk eg: crossing a road and have to wait for a car to go past.
- Let's go when moving on a walk or getting him from inside to outside
- Party/Here recall to come back to me or come over to me
- Out getting out of the kitchen or going outside
- In for getting in the car or inside the house
- Off Off furniture or a bed

## Other stuff

He feels the cold and will get up to get his coat put on.

He is used to having his nails trimmed with a dremmel. Last done on 13 October

He has growled twice now at Kyle when he was eating a bone and Kyle was trying to walk past to go to the grass. So if the object value is high he will protect a little. This only happened this week.

He sometimes growls in his sleep! But this only lasts for a few seconds.

Her does go into a very deep sleep and I have startled him a couple times thinking he heard me coming near. But he has never growled or snapped on waking. If I need to touch him or get him up I make sure to call his name and make sure his head pops up so not to scare him.
